



STATEMENT OF THE FOLLOWING DEMANDS.

1. (a) All railwaymen be treated as Industrial Workers with full Trade Union rights, including the right to negotiate.  
(b) The working hours of railwaymen shall not exceed eight hours per day.  
(c) There shall be job evaluation of all railwaymen through a scientific system to be followed by clear reclassification and regularization with the non-l-baed-minimum wage or the wage for the lowest paid workers.

SUB: SERVICE OF NOTICE BY THE NRMU ON THE GM C.RLY.

In accordance with the directive issued by the National Co-ordination Committee for Railwaymen's Struggle, the National Rly. Mazdoor Union served strike notice on the General Manager, Central Rly. on 23rd April 1974, a copy of the strike notice is enclosed herewith.

One copy of the Notice was served at about 11.00 hours through the usual method of sending the dak and acknowledgement obtained. In the evening a mammoth demonstration, which was participated by more than 20,000 Railwaymen, marched through the office of the General Manager Central Railway and the constituents of the Central Railway Co-ordination Committee served their strike notices on the General Manager, Shri B.D. Mehra personally, who was present in his office to receive the notice. The demonstration was so massive that no such demonstration was ever by the workers of the Central Railway during many many years. The tr was completely jammed for two hours. The notices for strike were served by the following organisations :

- 1) National Railway Mazdoor Union
- 2) Madhya Railway Karmachari Sangh
- 3) All India Loco Running Staff Association (C.Rly.)
- 4) OHE Staff Association, Kalyan.
- 5) All India Ticket Checking Staff Association (C.Rly.)

Information has also been received that the All India Minis Staff Association, Indian Railways Technical Supervisory Staff Assoc have also served the strike notice on the General Manager. The Motor Association of the Bombay Division (C.Rly.) have also served a strike on the Divisional Supdt., Bombay stating that they are going on strike 8th May 1974 on 11.00 hours. The demonstration of Bombay based Unions on the Central Railway and Western Railway was unique and shows the extent of mobilisation that has been made on both these Railways. According to conservative estimate of the Central Railway Administration they expect 65% of the Railway workers on both these Railways are going to participate in the ensuing strike. The morale of the workers has been very much boosted by the cent per cent participation of railway workers. On 22nd we had also held a meeting of the Working Committee of the Union and the extent of preparation that is going on other divisions also. Some steps are also taken to further intensify the campaign and according steps have been taken. Today I have received a letter from the General Manager, Central Railway stating that the strike is illegal. I am enclosing herewith a copy of the same for your information. I have also been informed that similar letters have been issued by the General Manager, W.Rly. to the Western Railway Employees' Union. Today morning the RI Defence of India Rules





In pursuance of the resolution adopted in the historic National Convention of Railwaymen held at Delhi on 27th of February, 1974 under the Presidentship of Comrade George Fernandes, all the Organisations of Railwaymen of Tinsukia area in a joint meeting held on 15th of March, 1974 under the Presidentship of Comrade B.N. Thakur ratified the Delhi Resolution, formed a NATIONAL COORDINATION COMMITTEE FOR RAILWAYMEN's STRUGGLE Tinsukia area, as a common forum to launch a struggle for the achievement of the following genuine and legitimate demands :-

1. (a) All Railwaymen be treated as Industrial workers with full trade Union rights including the rights to negotiate.  
(b) The working hours of Railwaymen shall not exceed eight per day.  
(c) Scientific job evaluation, reclassification and regradation with the need based minimum wage as the wage for the lowest paid workers.  
(d) Pending the completion of job evaluation, reclassification & immediate parity in wages with those workers in the Central undertaking viz; H.C., BHEL, HSMT etc.
2. D.A. be linked to the cost of living index with full neutralisation for every rise of 4 points in a six month period.
3. Bonus @ one months wage for 1971/72 and 1972/73.
4. Decentralisation of all casual railwaymen and confirmation
5. Adequate and subsidised foodgrains and other essential commodities, through departmental runshop.
6. All victimisation cases should be withdrawn.
