The Action Committee of the National Co-ordination Committee for Railwaymen's Struggle met in New Delhi today.

The meeting reviewed the situation in regard to victimisation on the railways as also the persistent refusal of Rail Bhavan to negotiate on the legitimate demands of the railwaymen. It was noted that about 3600 permanent workmen and nearly 15,000 casual workmen have not yet been taken back on work, and penal transfers, demotions and other punishment is meted to those who have been reinstated since the strike.

The meeting demanded the immediate reinstatement of all victimised workmen and negotiations on the general demands.

It was decided to convene a National Convention of Railwaymen at Calcutta. The dates of the Convention would be finalised at the next meeting of the Action Committee scheduled to be held in New Delhi on March 15, '75.

PRESS RELEASE

The representatives of Central Government Employees Organisations who are signatories to this statement condemn the Government's action in striking a deal with a section of its employees' organisations in blatant violation of the principles on which the J.C.M. was set up. It is obvious that the Government's action was motivated with the sole desire to further disrupt the Central Government employees movement and thus weaken the employees capacity to effectively resist government's anti-worker policies.

We reject outright this entire deal which is full of very dangerous implications, like :

- (I) repudiation of the agreement of 1967 on automatic grant of D.A. instalments as and when due;
- (II) legalising the delay caused by the Government on this issue;
- (III) introducing a new scheme of voluntary deposit of 50% of D.A. dues in P.F. Accounts with a low rate of interest, thus in effect accepting the Compulsory Deposit Scheme of 50% of D.A.;
- (IV) showing a connivance of a section of the leadership in what appears to be an attempt to fully do away with even the existing inadequate formula of D.A. etc.

We warn the employees that the end result of the collusion between the Government and a section of the Employees leadership could as well be the introduction of wage freeze through backdoor deals.

The meeting calls upon all Central Government employees unions to mobilise their members throughout the country educating them on the above dangerous implications of the last deal on D.A. With a view to register their emphatic protest at this anti-worker deal, the meeting calls upon all Central Government employees to observe 13th March, 1975, as All India Protest Day by holding Joint Mass rallies and Processions to demand that:

- 1. The representatives of all Central Government Employees' Organisations should be invited for the D.A. negotiations which are to held on 15th March 1975.
- 2. The 4 instalments of D.A. which have since become due should immediately be released.
- 3. The decision to hold back the arrears of D.A. increases upto 31-12-1974 in P.F. Account be reversed.

4. The scope of the forthcoming discussions should be spelled out by the Government sufficiently in advance so that employees Organisations may meet and formulate their views thereon.

This meeting also appeals to all other Central Government Employees' Organisations to close the rank and to adopt a principled and united approach so that a concerted effort to force the Government on the issue of a bilateral settlement for revision of wages on sound and well known norms is possible and the Government's game to either do away with D.A. Scheme altogether or to dilute the existing formula is defeated.



This convention, therefore, comes to the inescapable conclusion that the Railway Administration is not interested in restoring normalcy in its relationship with the employees and wants to continue the policy of confrontation and victimisation. The convention wishes to remind the Railway administration that the Railwaymen are not defeated and vanquished soldiers and will rise again as one man on a call from their leadership.

This convention, therefore, demands of the concerned authorities - 1) to rehabilitate all dismissed ~~employees~~ workers.

2) to vacate all kinds of victimisation like *reversion, transfer etc.*

3) to resume negotiations with NCCRS.

(5) 4) to ensure full trade union and democratic rights and resolves to be in readiness to plunge into any effective form of action at short notice as per the call of NCCRS.

2. Wage freeze: During the last 3 years or so the Central & State Governments were planning to introduce wage freeze for workers. The President and Prime Minister among others had made no secret of it. This move was stalled by the stiff resistance from the organised working class. Having crushed the Railway strike the Government thought the opportune moment has come to introduce the obnoxious ordinance.

The ordinance not only freezes further rise in DA and Pay but also erodes and cuts the real wage. The argument of the Govt. that it is intended to prevent inflation is untenable as wage rise had nothing to do with price rise to control which Government have taken no action so far. Worse, the Government themselves have raised the prices of many essential commodities. The convention is of the opinion that the main causes of inflation are black money, deficit financing and indirect taxes resulting from Govt.'s wrong economic policies.

The convention resolves to join with the entire working class of this country to fight this black ordinance.
