VIEWS AND PROPOSALS OF THE ALL THDIA LOCO RUNNING STAFF ASSOCIATION PLACED EFFORE THE A.I.R.F. IN THE MEETING HELD ON 24TH JANUARY, 1974.

The All India Loto Running Staff Association had held all along that a broad-based united struggle of all sections of Central Covernment employees is necessary to wrench our just demands like need-based minimum wage on 15th I.L.C. norms, pay-scales based on proper job evaluation, linking of D.A. with price-index, bonus et., and have been making efforts towards such unity. The necessity for such a united - struggle was felt all the more after the Third Pay Commission submitted its retrograde recommendations and the Government after long parleys refused to concede the just demands.

The invitation extended by the AIRF was considered by the Working Committee in the above light. It may please be noted that for obvious reasons, there are reservations amongst the ranks of the Loco Running Staff. Despite the same two representatives were chosen to attend the meeting convened on 24th & 25th January, 1974, so that our genuine desire for building up broadest possible unity of Central Govt. employees to fight the retrograde recommendations and to win our just demands, is appreciated by all.

The LRSA has some concrete proposals about this. Firstly there should be national convention of all unions/associations of Central Govt. employees who wish to join hands for such a united struggle. Secondly common demands should be formulated and programme of struggle drawn from this convention. Some preparatory work undertaken before the convention in this regard would help finalisation of the demands and programme of struggle. Thirdly efforts should be made to form a Joint Council of Action to conduct the struggle, so that a sense of unity and confidence grows amongst the Central Government employees.

Considering the tremendous urge for unity amongst the Working class of the country, as reflected in struggle of Jute workers through out the country or the textile workers of Bombay and the present policy of the Government — to suppress the struggles, our Association appeals to all concerned for building up unity amongst the Central Govt. employees, who today are almost the worst-paid employees in organised sector.

In the event, the AIRF does not consider the proposal for convening a national convention on the lines stated above feasible, the LRSA is prepared to organise such a convention with the hope that the AIRF would co-operate in the same.

The Association would surely consider the views of Λ -I.R.F. and other organisations, as well as their suggestions and proposals if any and do their best in forging a broadest possible unity of Central Government employees as a whole.

DECLARATION ADOPTED BY THE MEETING OF REPRESENTATIVES OF RAILWAYMEN'S UNIONS/ ASSOCIATIONS IN NEW DELHI.

At the invitation of the All India Railwaymen's Federation, representatives from several Associations/Unions of Railwaymen attended a two days neeting on December 26 and 27, 1973, at the AIRF's Office in New Delhi. The neeting was presided over by the AIRF President, Mr. George Fernandes. The list of participants and the names of the Organisations is appended to this declaration.

The meeting discussed at great length the problems facing the 20,00,000 railwaymen in the country, both in regard to their working and living conditions, wages, employer-employees relationship, etc., and in regard to the organisational situation.

The meeting rejected the recommendations of the III Pay Commission and the Government's decisions thereon and agreed that no useful purpose would be served by trying to talk to the Government on these retrogessive recommendations.

The five demands submitted to the Chairman, Railway Board by the AIRF on November 8, 1972, viz:

- 1. (a) Reclassification of Railwaymen following job evaluation carried out through the point-rating system, and regradation of all employees concerned upon such reclassification:
 - (b) Pending reclassification and regradation all railwaymen including casual workmen be paid an interim increase in wages to bring their emoluments at least on par with those in such public sector undertakings, like Hindustan Machine Tools or with those of the workmen in the cement industry:
 - (c) Point to point adjustment be made while fixing the employees in the new payscales and in the interim pay structure:
 - 2. 100% neutralisation shall be given in Dearness Allowance to all workmen on every increase of 4 points in the 6-monthly average of theirdex.
 - 3. Bonus at 8.38 per cent of the gross annual earnings for the year 1971-72 and 1972-73 be paid to all railwaymen including casual employees.

- 4. Immediate decasualisation of all casual amployees on the railways:
- 5. Setting up of subsidised grainshops and a daily supply of 500 grans of foodgrains to the ration holders through these shops.

were endorsed by the meeting. The meeting demanded that the Reilway Board open negotiations on these demands immediately.

The demands pertaining to various vategories were considered.

There was unanimity that only through effective sanctions created through the widest possible unity of all railwaymen would it be possible for the railwaymen to achieve their general and sectional demands, and to fight a successful battle against harrassment and victimisation.

The various anomalies created by the recommendations of the III Pay commission and the Govt. s decisions thereon were also considered. It was felt that the struggle against the retrogessive decisions will have to be a part of a wider struggle to whieve the demands contained in the November 8 Charter of the AIRF. In the meanwhile, all-out efforts will have to made to prevent any cut or reduction in the amoluments of railwaymen and any withdrawal of any of their existing benefits or privileges.

The representatives of the various associations emphasised that their organisations were concerned with the right of representation of their sectional problems before the proper authorities at various levels. It was felt that certain structural changes within the framework of the AIRF could /rovide the necessary solution to this problem. The matter would be discussed further.

The necting felt that closer liasion between the AIRF and the categorywise organisations was necessary for the successful conduct of the railwaymen's movement for securing their demands.

It was felt that efforts should be made to contact all those category-wise organisations which for one reason or the other could not attend the current meeting, and snother, more representative, meeting be convened on January 24 and 25, 1974, in New Delhi.
