
The Industrial Committee on Building and Construction Industry is being convened soon and the Government has asked for suggestions for the agenda of the Committee meeting.

Subject: - Composition of the 1 t meeting of the Industrial Committee on Building and Construction Industry.

Sir.

I am directed to refer to your letter dated the 3rd February 1959 and to say that it is not correct that the seats allotted to the All-India Trade Union Congress on the above Committee have been reduced from 2 to 1. The rosition is that the Ad-Hoc Committee which met in Au ust 1955 22 seats for workers of which 2 were allotted to the All-Ladia Trade Union Congress. The regular Industrial Committee which was constituted in February '56 (vide this Ministry's Letter No. 10-218(4) dated the 3rd February 1956) has only 8 seats for workers. Of these one was allotted to the All-India Trade Union Congress at that time. The composition of the Industrial Committees is not fixed permanently and it is reviewed at the time of convening the meetings of the Committees. The composition of the Industrial Committee on Building and Construction Industry will also be reviewed when the question of convening its next meeting has been finalised.
