THE HON: MINISTER FOR RAILWAYS, GOVERNMENT OF INDIA, RAIL BHAVAN, NEW DELHI.

Sir,

WE the inhabitants around Ottakkal Railway
Station and nearby villages submit the following for your
kind attention and favourable disposal.

Ottakal Block Station as a train halt. This station which is situated in Ghat Section accessable only by rail, actually caters the needs of the surrounding villages, consisting of about 8,000 people and one Tribal Colony with welfare School etc.

Quilon-Shencotta High way (P.w.D.) is two to three K.Ms away from the Railway line and the terrain is very difficult for easy accessability. We are solely depending on this Railway Station for the transport of our Agricultural produces to Punalur and Thenmalai which are the only nearby marketing places. Ottakkal is also a pilgrim centre for Muslims and there is a regular flow of passengers from Tamil Nadu to the Ottakkal Mosque. There is an average issue of ten season tickets from this station. During season the monthly collection comes to N.4,000/- and above.

The approach road from the said Highway to the Railway station is being taken up by Kerala Government for metalling and tarring at a cost of Rs.10/- lakhs. When this road is completed the collection of the Railway station shall improve considerably.

The Kallada Irrigation Dam which is only about 4 Kms. from this Station has been scheduled to be commissioned by July next and this place is going to become a Tourist Centre by the formation of a big lake about 5 Sq. Miles, surrounded by very beatiful natural forest. This fact must be given the top importance in taking a decision about the status of the Rail way Station.

Any move to reduce this station as a Train Halt will be detrimental to the Developments Schemes which are being considered by the Government and Local authorities.
