The Enquiry is expected to be more comprehensive than the previous two and will have a wider scope. The main object of conducting the Third Enquiry is to have a broad assessment of the impact of the various developmental schemes launched under the First and, the Second Plans, designed to promote rural welfare in general and agricultural welfare in Ti basanada 3) A note on the particular. Special emphasis will have to be laid, among other things, on 4) Consolidated Cone list - uncontro IV. measurement of:

- (i) unemployment and under-employment among agricultural labourers.
- (ii) levels of living of agricultural labour households.
- (iii) valid estimates regarding social and economic characteristics of agricultural labour households for each State and for each one of the zones into which the various States may be divided.


