



BULLETS, ARRESTS & LATHIS faced by workmen
in M/s. Pharmed Pvt. Ltd., S. K. F., Capsulation Services,
Wander Pharmed, Pharm Pack at Chembur, Bombay.

Dear Friends,

It is more than 20 days that about 800 workmen in the above five companies have been facing a totally unprovoked, unjustified and unlawful lockout since 10th Sept, 1966. This large mass of conscious workmen including about 200 educated working girls have to face this long drawn out lock-out for their only sin of defending their Unions from the attacks made by these employers on the cream of their leadership. Come what may, these workmen have taken a solemn vow that none of their leaders shall be touched and their strong Trade-Unions shall not be trifled with by these reactionary employers.

The managements of these companies after slamming the main gates of the factory in the face of the workmen on 10th Sept, 1966, compelled them to squat in front of these five factories housed in the same compound and which function as part of the big pharmaceutical empire built by Dr. Nanji, under the scorching and oppressive heat and intermitten pouring rains for the last 20 days. These valiant boys and girls braved the unsympathetic elements and emboldened themselves further to face the attacks at the hands of the police who have in keeping with their traditions acted hand in glove with the management to inflict untold repression on these workmen.

Shridhar Shetty, Bhikaji Veer, David Anthony, Machinder, & Vishnu Patil, the front-ranking leaders of the workmen were arrested by Chembur

Police Stn. on charges of rioting, stone throwing etc. on 15th Sept. 1966 and were kept in the Police Custody till 22nd Sept. 1966.

On 27th Sept. 1966, 54 working girls drawn from Pharmed, Pharmpack, S. K. F. & Wander Pharmed were lathi-charged & put under arrest in the afternoon and were locked-up at Bhoiwada Police Stn. They could be released on bail only after midnight, and they could reach their houses in the early hours of the morning of the next day.

With all this harassment the expectations of the employers & police that the workmen would get demoralised and particularly the militant spirit of the large mass of the female workers would be dampened; were totally falsified. Again the next day the entire mass of the boys & girls were at the gates to assert their right and to safeguard their sacred privilege of maintaining their trade-unions and protecting their leaders.

Obviously, such consolidated will and united strength so gloriously demonstrated by the workmen made the elements in the management lose balance of their mind.

On Thursday, 29th Sept. 1966, the hirelings of the management, under the command of the notorious sworn enemy of the workmen, one Mr. Bharucha, a Security Officer, accompanied by one Sultankhan who is a known bully and a goonda, and deliberately drove a van straight on the workmen standing & shouting slogans in front of the gates. The van knocked down a workman by name Shri Babu Bhise, who received serious head injuries. Mrs. Roza Deshpande, General Secretary of the Union was thrown against another car and could have been crushed to death but for the presence of mind shown by the other workmen in pulling her out; Smt. Mayura a working girl in Pharmed Pvt. Ltd., who was also saved by similar intervention of the other workmen and was rendered unconscious for three hours.

As if all this was not exasperating, this truck was followed by another van which was similarly driven in a rash and negligent manner by the afore-said Bharucha. This downright coward and one of the arch-villains in the whole game, brandished his loaded revolver and aimed at the leaders of the workmen. Shri Khan of Pharmed and Shri Saldhana of Wander Pharmed were the apparent targets. Without giving a second thought, Bharucha fired one after another six shots all directly aimed at these leaders and the workmen.

A bullet buzzed past the ear of Khan and but for the action of other workmen in lying down on the ground none of the bullets was emptied in any one of these innocent workmen. Of course, all this happened in broad day light and in the presence of Custodians of Law and Order that is POLICE. Bharucha, Sultankhan, and other gangsters and bullies, however had to take to their heels with the active help of the police. **Bharucha has not been arrested. Sultankhan is still breathing free air of our free country.**

But the farce of Law and Order being staged by Dr. Nanji and Police does not end here. It is incredible to believe that the Union leaders Raghunath Naik and other injured workers who went to the Chembur Police Station to lodge the complaint against Bharucha and Sultan Khan, *have been put under arrest*. In all fairness we would like to ask what mysterious power in the hands of Dr. Nanji and the whole management can commit such crimes and yet go scotfree, can sabotage production in such a vital industry and yet nothing should move?

The question that we have to pose and the Govt. has to answer is as to whether such atrocities perpetuated upon the workmen are to go unchallenged. The Govt. has also to answer as to whether these culprits are not going to be put in the docks or they are to let go with offences which are *per se* cognisable and which require to be put down with a firm hand.

Then again worse than these mercenary hirlings of the employers, the managements themselves have to be charged for holding the whole community at ransom by suspending production of life saving drugs in all these five companies for the last 20 days for no fault of the workmen. Should we suppose that in this year of 1966 these employers should be allowed to close down the factories and stop production of pharmaceuticals for such a long period only because they are determined to isolate the Trade Union leaders in these five companies and victimise them and smash their trade unions ultimately?

We wished that the Govt. which shouts from the housetops about its tall claims to building a socialistic pattern of society, and make loud professions about their bias towards the common man had fared better in this whole grim struggle of the pharmaceutical workmen in these five companies.

All these days, the Govt. Labour Office has not moved an inch. The Labour Minister is not to be found anywhere in the city.

No efforts have been made by the Govt. or the Ministry to bring down the swollen headed employers of these five companies.

But the pharmaceutical workmen in the City and the State with the help and active support of Maharashtra State Pharmaceuticals Employees' Federation which covers the entire strength of the workmen of the pharmaceutical industry in the State shall not take these attacks on the rights and privileges of the workmen to organise, sustain and expand their Trade-Unions, lying low and shall do every thing in their power to see that this glorious struggle is crowned with ultimate success.


