Dear Sir,

You are aware that Article 311 as it exists today, ensures necessary security and safety for the Central & State Govt. Employees to defend their cases. This article enjoins that no Govt. Employee shall be dismissed or removed or reduced in rank until he has been given a REASONABLE OPPORTUNITY of showing cause against action proposed to be taken against him. The presence of this provision in the Constitution used to protect the Govt. Employees from being thrown out of job by ill-advised disciplinary actions against them.

You are also aware that the Government seeks to amend Article 311 of the Constitution by taking away the right of the Govt. Employees of being given a reasonable opportunity to defend their cases. If the Article 311 of the Constitution stands amended as proposed it will confer only an opportunity of 'being heard' in respect of the charges brought against Govt. Employees.

It is interesting to see that the Article 311 of the Constitution is a reproduction of Section 240 of 1935 Act. This means that the Govt. Employees have been given this reasonable opportunity since long.

The proposed amendment if carried through will provide a free handle to the Departmental Disciplinary Authorities to inflict any punishment on Govt. Employees as the entire disciplinary proceedings would only be a show.

A resolution passed by general body meeting of this Union which speaks for itself, is appended herewith.

I hope and trust you will use your good offices to prevail upon the Government to drop the amendment to Article 311 of the Constitution which aims at drastically curtailing rights and safe-guards of the Govt. Employees Central & State alike.



Resolution for authorisation to raise loan for
purchasing building.

.....

In consideration of the approval which the majority of C.W.C. members gave for the General Secretary's proposal to purchase a building for the Union and raising loan for the same, we hereby further authorise the General Secretary and the Treasurer to issue promotes on behalf of the Union to parties from whom they will take loans and pay interest on loans at the rate not more than what the bank-charges, i.e., $7\frac{1}{2}\%$.

They are further authorised to mortgage the building purchased to any bank, L.I.C. or any other party against loan not less than 50% of the cost of the building and the money so raised be paid back to those parties from whom the present loans have been raised.

This authorisation is being agreed by circulation as the C.W.C. members agreed to hold the C.W.C. meeting only after the purchase of the building and the donations and loans so far received from the branches and members are not sufficient.

RESOLUTION

(passed unanimously by the General Body meeting
of the Union held on 24th March.63)

This General Body meeting of the All India Postal Employees' Union, Bombay City Branch views with great concern the proposed amendment to Article 311 of the Constitution contained in the 15th Amendment Bill (Constitution).

In the opinion of this meeting such an amendment would be a severe attack on the rights and safe-guards so far enjoyed by the Civil Servants in as much as hereafter a Civil Servant will not get a second opportunity to show cause against action proposed to be taken against him, nor will he be given an opportunity to refute the findings of the Enquiry Officer. This would cripple the Civil Servants and seriously jeopardise their rights. X

This meeting is of the opinion that this amendment would mean vesting wide powers in the Disciplinary Authorities.

This meeting is of the opinion that the Government should not have come out with this amendment drastically curtailing rights and safe-guards of the Government Employees when they have taken a pledge to wholeheartedly co-operate with the Govt. in National Defence Efforts.

This meeting, therefore, requests the Govt. of India to drop this amendment.

This meeting appeals to all members of Lok Sabha, Rajya Sabha and all political and social leaders in the country to use their good offices to see that the proposed amendment is dropped.

This meeting appeals to all Trade Union Centres to prevail upon the Govt. of India to drop the proposed amendment as about 40 lacs of Central & State Govt. Employees will be reduced to the status of slaves.

This meeting further requests the National Federation of P & T Employees to take steps to organise such trade Union agitation as would not hamper the National Defence Efforts in any manner what-so-ever and requests the N.F.P.T.E. to establish contacts with other organisations in the Central & State services so as to build up unbreakable unity amongst Central & State Govt. Employees for the purpose of launching an agitational programme.

This meeting directs the City Secretary to hold group meetings in Bombay City Post Offices and educate rank and file members to be/ready to act on the directive from the National Federation of P & T Employees.
