

For the mass rally on the concluding day, he thinks an amplifier of some 60 or more Watts, about 24 units with Horns - preferably trumpet Horns - and Line Transformers will be required. This equipment can cover a rally of about a lakh.

Will you therefore please let us know immediately what equipment you have from the above, or can procure and at what cost?

If necessary, Com. Katdare can bring with him an Amplifier of 80 Watts, at little cost such as would have to be incurred on transport etc.

Please reply immediately, so that Com. Katdare can fix his programme accordingly.
