Regarding the alleged violation of the Code of discipline by the management of the Tatanager Foundry Co. Ltd. , Sri Ratan Rai said that the x cases of 329 workers who were not being taken back to vork by the miricement were pliced both before the Asstt.Labour Commissioner, Jimshedpur and I bour Commissioner, but no action was taken by the Jabour Department.

The Libour Commissioner explined the bickground of the cine and clarified that it was due to his initiative that the management agreed to extend the date of registration for taking back all the remaining workers. But since many workman did not avail of the opportunity, they were not taken back to work.

The Chairman said that the management recently retrenched about 700 workmen and the issue has been referred to adjudication. With this background, the complaint about the refusal of the management of the Tatangar Foundry Co. Itd to take back the remaining workmen in 1958 had to ceased to have practical significant. But since it was complaint under the code of Discipline, responsibility for the breach of the Code had to be fixed. The Chairman, therefore, assured that further enquiry into the complaint would be made after giving notice to the perties.

Regarding the issue km of de-recognition of the Labour Union at Darbhanga Sugar Co. 1td., the Committee decided that the matter would be taken up in the next meeting. The committee also dedided the Union should be sked togive their commentson the letter of the Maragement dated the 23rd Dec., 1959. After obtaining the comments of the Union, The Implementation Cell should prepare a note on the case

employment among the mace workers and home-splitters. The number of mice workers affected by this closure is about 40 thousands & the home-splitters about a lac. In fact if dependents are included about 5 lac population is faced with starvation due to this closure. The situation is daily growing worse, in the absence of workers having any alternative source of income or employment. They are resurting to such food as Mahua, Pokaha, Gullar etc. and this in turn is resulting into malnutrition and stomach diseases, e.g., dhorreak etc. Already reports of death have been received and large number of cases of diorreah have been reported. Infants are not getting milk and many of them are being kept on 'Satual' by their parets. If immediate steps are not taken or the factories are not opened widespread diseases and starvation deaths will start soon.

The strike of mica dealers is against the imposition of multi point sales tax which in the present situation completely exempts the mica miner-shipper group among the mica dealers who are the big guns in the trade. It only affects the small dealers who number about 1800 out of about 2000 licensed dealers in mica trade. So far as the dealers are concerned they do no not oppose imposition of tax but want it to be imposed in such a w way as it may equally affect all dealers otherwise there is every possibility of small dealers being squeezed out of the trade in unequal competition.

The Govt may resolve this deadlock by imposing production tax or levy at a rate which may not affect adver adversely the state Exchequer. This should be done both in view of the terrible distress of a great number of people and also to save the industry which is mainly an export production and thus foreign-exchange earner. In fact the Govt. have made special concession to lac industry so far as sales tax is concerned. They can and should take special measures in respect of mica industry also.

The Bihat Mica Mazdoor Sangathan, an affiliate of AITUC have in a memorandum to the Chief Minister axxx has demanded that the dispute should be immediately settled so that the factories may be opened & also declare the area to be a distressesd area so long the factories remain closed and carry on relief measures and provide alternative work.

It has also demanded that the interest of workers be protected by declaring all retronchment during this period be declared illegal, reterenchment and laid off workers be paid adequate compensation and the period of closure should not affect the continuity of service of workers.

The Govt. which are the key factor in the situation is inactive and complement. They need be moved by popular pressure.

#### STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Bill seeks to replace the Punjab Criminal Law (Amendment) Ordinance, 1960, promulgated by the Governor to secure deterrent punishments for those who assist persons against whom warrants of arrest have been issued with the intention of preventing their apprehension, omit to attend in obedience to proclamations under section'87 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, give false names and other particulars of identity in the course of investigation or trial of such offences, and instigate, incite or otherwise encourage disobedience of orders under section 144 of the said Code.

to supplement the Criminal Law applicable in the State of Punjab.

BE it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Punjab in the Eleventh Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be called the Punjab Criminal Law (Amendment) Act, 1960.

Short title, extent and duration,

- (2) It extends to the whole of the State of Punjab.
- (3) It shall remain in force for a period of three years from the date of the commencement of this Act.
- 2. In this Act, "scheduled offence" means an offence specified in the Definition. Schedule.

In each State, this work should be allotted to one of the Secretaries and if in any month he is unable to do it, it should be his job to make alternative arrangements.

unconcious. Scores of people thus dead or unconcious were thrown

in the truck like bags.

The authorities say that only one is dead and 6 or 7 are injured. This is absolutely wrong. I sent our journalist Comrade Za Zayaullah. He has reported to me that another man is missing and must be dead. The number of dead must be 5 according to the men on the spot. Thenumber of injured must be near one hundred. Com. Zayaullah who went there on the 19th. says he found many injured in their homes who did not go to the hospital for fear of being arrested. He himself took one woman with bullet injury to the hospital for treatment. He contacted the authorities and says that altogether 1265 men have been arrested. They have been lodged in Mirzapur, Banaras Jails and Rihand area. Mirzapur Jail hospital is full of injured Rihand workers.

On the 19th. a huge procession of women workers was taken out. There is a latge number of women workers in the construction. This procession was lathi-charged and dispersed. The whole Rihand area is besieged by P.A.C. and Civil Police men. Batallions from Ramnagar and Grakhpur had arrived. It is estimated that more than one thousand is the strength of the force concentrated in this area. Reign of terror is prevailing but the workers are peaceful but firm. Inspite of coercion no worker is going for work. Before the firing the whole agitation was going on very peacefully and with commendable organisation. They had raised money and grain and were feeding those whose wages were low and who used to buy ration

daily.

At present the condition of these workerswhose wages are low is very bad.Com.Zayaullah himself collected grain yesterday and arranged for feeding them.When these workers were gathered in a compound Police Force came and declared the gathering illegal. Com.Zayaullah retorted that this was private place and the police cannot interfere.He challanged them to take action and he will face anything but the workers won't disperse unless they have taken t their food.The Dy.S.P. then withdrew with his force.

The Commissioner Varanasi Division, Labour Commissioner, Asstt. Labour Commissioner Allahabad. Distt. Magistrate along with all the S.D.Ms. are camping at the Rihand Dam. I have sent another wire to Banaras for Rustom to come. If you can send Com. Jharkhande Rai it will be good. Contact S.M. Bannerji and ask him to come.

The meeting of the Working Committee of the U.P. Trade Union Congress was held on May 26, 1960, at Kanpur under the Presidentship of Sri S.S. Yusuf.

Sinha and Ashok Bose for collecting half of the total amount proposed to be spent in construction of the hall.

#### 3. COM SHIV CHARMA'S LETTER OF RESIGNATION:

Before the agenda was actually taken up, Com Shiv Sharma told to the meeting that as a result of his talks with Com Kali Shanker Shukla and other comrades, he didnot want his letter to be discussed in that meeting and requested that the same should be taken up in some other meeting.

We', on behalf of the Chungi employees of City Bourd, pohra Dan have to submit as under:-

- to the Leval Endies of Ster Fradesh vide Government of Utter Pradesh notification no. 795(LL)/XVIII(L)420(LL)50 dated March 26th, 1952.
- 2. That in secondards with section 13 of the Ast and rule 24 of the U.P. Winimuz Warez Rules, the working hours of the employees have been fixed at a maximum of 8% hours per day.
- 3. That we the Chungi employees of City Board Dehra Dun are this estand by the Minksum Wagas Act, 1948.
- 4. That, however, the City Board, Debre Dun is continuing to amploy us for from 12 to 16 hours per day, on all days of the week, in violation of the provisions of law, quoted at pera 2 above.
- 5. That, for this exorbitantly long overtime work extorted from us, we have never been paid may evertime wages at all, in violation of section 13(0) of the Winimum Wager Act, 1945.
- 5. That ever since the Rimimum Wages Act was extended to us we have been constantly representing to the authorities of City Board Dehra am not to compel us to went in violation of the requirements of law and justice.
- 7. That, however, the said authorities have no attention to the innumerable representations and have continue ) be reserve us to persons work for exemptionally long hore, illustely, without any courtime wages at all, under threat and intimidation.
- 6. That for the last many years we have also been representing to the Labour Considerator, U.P. Ranpur, h.C.O. Recrut, A.R.C.O. Sabaranpur, he District Eggistrate Dehma Dun and the Labour Inspector of the district to get the provision of the Minimum Wagas Act as regards the duration of the house of work implemented in our department.
- 9. That though all these authorities have agreed that injustice is being done to us in violation of the clear provision of law, and have advised the authorities of City Board. Dehra Dun to implement the Act, the latter have refused to listen to this advice. We understand that the Labour Inspector, behra Dun has time and again issued show cause notices to the City Board during the last few years but in vain.

- 10. That we represented the matter two years back to the Hon. Parliamentary Secretary to the Hon. Minister for Labour, Uttar Predash Gavegament, Sri H.N. Babugune, in writing and through a deputation. He also was sympathetical and promised to do the needful in the matter.
- 11. That, now 8 years after the extension of the Act to we and constant and innumerable representations to every quarter, the employees in question have been forced to determine to take to direct action in the form of hungerstrikes etc. to compel the City Board, Dahra Dun to meto cut justice even & his late hour.
- 12. That however, before boy give notice, shortly, for the direct action, they are approaching you emurgically kindly to intervend impediately in the matter before the situation takes a more complicated turn.
- 13. That, accordingly, we appeal to you kin fly to instruct immediately biths Chairman City Board Dohra Dun to implement the Minimum Wagoo Act, 1948 up to regards the hours of work, fix our hours of work in accirdance with the express provisions of law and pay us our evertime duck since the extension of the Act to us.
- 14. That we would request you kindly also to warn the said Board's authorities, that if they do not so the above immediately, prospection will be launched against them by the State.
- 15. That we would request you earnestly, immediately to inform us of the action taken in this regard.
- 16. That the employees in question will be for ever grateful to you for this act of kindness and justice.

# BRIEF REPORT ON THE STATE CONFERENCE OF H.M.S. (Held on May 29 & 30, 1960 at Lucknow.)

45 persons holding 82 delegate cards attended the Conference.

Sri Vimal Mehrotra, Outgoing General Secretary, submitted the Report which had the colour of anti-communism. Criticism was also made in the Report of the Government Labour policy which it held to be pro-employer.

Resolutions condemning the alleged agression By China, criticising the Anti-labour policy of the U.P. Government, demanding Wage Boards for various industries were passed.

On the eve of elections 20 persons led by Sri Brij Kishore Shastri walked-out of the conference.

The two groups held their own seperate elections. One group elected Sri Shibban Lal Saexena M.P., Sri Vimal Mehrotra and Sri Madan Pandey M.L.A. as President, General Secretary and Treasurer respectively.

The other group of 'old ones' elected Sri Tara Chandra Sethi and Sri Brij Kishore Shastri as President and General Secretary respectively.

Sri Ganesh Dutta Bajpai, former President did not remain in either of the groups claiming themselves as U.P. Branch of the H.M.S.

M.M.S. is an approved Federation and for that purpose the Labour Department continues to recognise the old set-uf office-bearers with Sri Ganesh Dutta Bajpai as President and Sri Vimal Mehrotra as General Secretary.

During the Conference an effort of conciliation was made by some persons who proposed  $S_{T}i$  Shibban Lal Saxena as Fresidant and  $S_{T}i$  Brij Kishore Shastri as  $G_{e}neral$  Secretary. But this proposal was rejected by  $S_{T}i$  Saxena and  $S_{T}i$  Shastri both.

#### ON ORGANISATIONAL METHODS

Dear Comrades,

The General Council of the AITUC at its session in Delhi in February devoted considerable attention to the organisational problems facing trade unions. It was revealed during discussions and from the experience of comrades who were dealing with verification of trade union membership that serious weaknesses exist in many unions in their organisational practices.

In this connection, the serious problem which emerged was the weakness in office functioning in the case of several unions. This, of course, is part of the overall problem of training cadres, the shortage of which is seriously felt in many centres. However, it is also a fact that even where cadres with the required calibre exist, things are not so good because of the lack of due consciousness and consequently not paying requisite attention to organisational work. This is seen in the failure to organise collections of membership fee periodically, maintenance of membership registers and account books, submission of returns, payment of affiliation fees, etc.

The General Council set up a Standing Credential Committee to scrutinise these aspects of trade union functioning. Where serious lapses are noted, the Committee is authorised to recommend disaffiliation of defaulting unions.

#### IMMEDIATE TASKS

On March 31, 1960, the official year 1959-60 will come to a close and unions should from now on take special steps in connection with the verification of membership as on 31.2.60, in the following manner:

- (1) a. Membership registers and account books should be made uptodate and all arrears on membership dues as per provision of the Constitution of the Union collected immediately.
  - b. Wherever members have been re-enrolled during the year because of non-payment for certain months in accordance with the constitution of the Union, arrears should be collected and formal Executive decisions taken.
  - c. Wherever members are allowed to pay arrears and remain on the live register of membership, necessary sanction of the Executive Committee/General Council of the Union should be obtained.
  - d. First concentrate on collection of current dues then arrears. In verification, if current dues are outstanding, such membership will not be taken into account .
- (2) Annual returns should be sent latest by end of June. Official procedure is being made strict and unions will be de-registered if returns are not sent in time. A copy of the return should be endorsed to AITUC centre and STUCs.
- (3) Those unions who have not remitted affiliation fees for 1959-60 should pay their dues immediately since the year is coming to a close. During verification, it was found that since some unions could not produce receipt for affiliation fee paid, they were scored out from AITUC claims.
- (4) If you have any objections regarding the procedure or official practice in conducting verification of membership for the year ending 31.3.59, please write to us immediately.
