This plan includes such major economic projects as the Soyuz main gas pipeline stretching for 2,750 kilometres from the Orenburg area to the Western border of the USSR, which is meant for supplying over 15,000 million cubic metres of gas a year to the European CMEA countries and the construction of which has been in the main completed; the 750-kilovolt power transmission line between Vinnitsa (USSR) and Albertirsa (Hungary) with a total stretch exceeding 800 kilometres--it was put into service at the end of 1978; the Ust Ilimsky cellulose plant with a capacity of 500,000 tons of high-grade pulp a year; the Kiyembayevsky asbestos mining and enriching combine with a capacity of 500,000 tons a year; the instalment of new capacities for nickel and cobalt production with an annual capacity of 30,000 tons in the Republic of Cuba, and some other projects, which are being built through joint effort.

The plan focuses considerable attention on the joint tackling of scientific and technical problems that are of particularly great importance for the development of the economies of and cooperation between the countries in the forthcoming period, especially problems bearing on fuel, energy and raw materials. The agreed plan of multilateral integration measures also includes steps to specialise and cooperate production on a multilateral basis, which require considerable capital investments by countries concerned.

At present, in the machine-building field alone, there are 78 multilateral agreements signed on specialisation and cooperation in production, covering the output of more than 8,000 engineering items.

Specialisation and cooperation embrace also the manufacture of power-generating equipment, means of electronics, sea and river vessels, heavy-duty motor vehicles, special metal-cutting machinetools and forge-and-press equipment, tractor and agricultural engineering products, diesel locomotives, machines and equipment for construction and for the industry of building materials, and many other sectors of production. A major result of cooperation is the creation of the Single System of Computers and the organisation of their production in the CMEA countries on the basis of specialisation and cooperation.

The Communist and Workers' Parties of the socialist community countries are an inspiring and guiding force of all CMEA's activities. It is they that at all stages of socialist construction in the CMEA member-countries have worked out and continue to work out the strategy and tactics of cooperation between the fraternal countries.

In 1969, leaders of the Communist and Workers' Parties and heads of government of the CMEA member-countries, at the 23rd special session, formulated the main tasks and basic lines of further cooperation and the 25th session of the Council for Mutual Economic Assistance in 1971 adopted unanimously a comprehensive programme for the further deepening and perfecting of cooperation and development of socialist economic integration, a document of great political significance.

The fulfilment of the Comprehensive Programme helps CMEA member-countries to make fuller use of the advantages of the socialist economic system and of the international socialist division of labour in the interests of promoting the economic and defence might and improving the popular well-being. At the 25th CPSU Congress Leonid Brezhnev pointed out: "Implementation of this Comprehensive Programme has already significantly deepened our economic interaction, and made our economies mutually complementary to a greater extent to the considerable advantage of all concerned."

Cooperation in planning and especially in coordinating national economic plans is the principal method of organising cooperation between CMEA member-countries, of developing and deepening the international socialist division of labour. The drawing up by collective efforts of CMEA countries and bodies of an agreed plan of multilateral integration measures of the CMEA member-countries for 1976-1980, closely tied in with the Comprehensive Programme, was an important new step in extending and improving that method. The scope of this plan can be gauged if only from the fact that it embraces 28 major projects with an estimated cost of over 9,000 million roubles.


