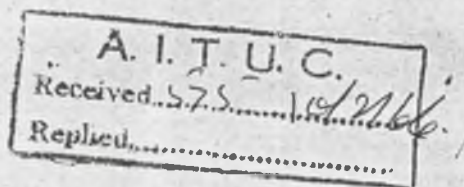

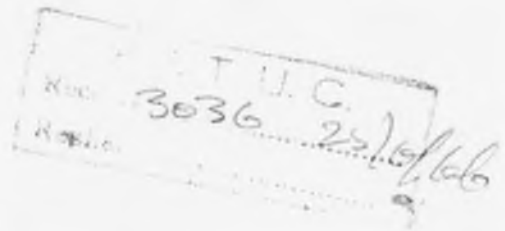

Dear Comrade,

This has reference to your letter addressed to Shri S.C. Bajpai, Labour Commissioner, Delhi, without date but copy received by us on 22.6.66.

This letter has been sent on behalf of a Textile Union of Swatantra Bharat Mills and signed by you as its Vice President. On page 4 of the letter you have accused the leadership of the Kapra Mazdoor Ekta Union of being in league with the management and indulging in anti-labour practices. Copy of this letter has been sent by you to the Chief Commissioner, Deputy Commissioner, the Supdt. of Police and the S.H.O. Motinagar.

You are no doubt aware of the unanimous decision of the General Council of the AITUC held at Bombay, and later endorsed by the 27th session at Bombay that this union on behalf of which you have signed as the Vice President. This decision refused affiliation to this union on the grounds of its being a rival to an affiliated union of the AITUC namely Kapra Mazdoor Ekta Union. It is surprising how you can square your being a member of the Working Committee of the AITUC with such a situation.

The contents of the letter are slanderous to the AITUC and its unions and it is surprising that you could bring yourself to write such a letter to the Labour and Civil authorities .

I would like you to explain your position so that your letter could be placed before the W.C. of the AITUC along with your explanation, if any, for appropriate action. Your reply should reach us within one week of the date of this letter.

Dear Comrade Chadayammari,

At the Bombay Session of the AITUC from among the list there we received from the STUC for inclusion in the General Council of the AITUC I had felt that perhaps it may be possible subject to the total number not increasing to accommodate Com. T.C.N. Menon from Kerala in the General Council of the AITUC. As his name was first from among those who were dropped after adjustments. At one time when there were certain objections as to why the name of Com. T.C.N. Menon is being thought of I had replied that in the Kerala list his name was on the top of those who could not be included in the General Council. Subsequently when we totalled up the ~~figure~~ figure from Kerala and other States we found that it shall not be possible to include Com. T.C.N. Menon in the General Council. As in that case the total number will exceed than what is provided for in the constitution and so the name of Com. T.C.N. Menon does not appear in the list of General Council Members published in the TUR. I hope you and Com. T.C.N. Menon will appreciate the implications.
